Robert A.M. Stern's 20 East End Avenue

Although his legant monoliths hearken back to the Gilded Age, Robern A.M. Stern's newest building — 20 East End Avenue — will offer residents a more scaled-down version of pre-war living. The 43 units will start at just 2,000 square feet (and \$4.5 million) and will have access to amenities like a curated library and a wine cellar. Stern has designed not just the skeleton, but also the insides of the 17-story building. "The interior design and the architecture should really complement one another," says Edward Baquero, president of Corigin Real Estate, the developers. "So we hired Bob Stern to do both." Key Stern elements include the lobby (above) and billiard room. The sales center, at 744 Madison Ave., will open before the end of the year, with sales beginning this week. 20eastend.com
